ROY NAGATOSHI BRING YOUR OWN TREE CRITIQUE

We are very happy to have Roy Nagatoshi for our November program. For those of you new to bonsai, Roy is an accomplished bonsai artist with a well stocked bonsai nursery in Sylmar called Fuji Bonsai. Be sure to call in advance of a visit to be certain that Roy is going to be there because he is very happy to share his knowledge and experience with visitors.

This visit is a critique by Roy of a tree that **you bring in**. This is a very valuable opportunity to get expert feedback on your trees in order to speed their progress and address any issues they may have, like when to repot, how and when to prune or design questions. Roy will not whack off any bits of your bonsai without permission.

This kind of critique is useful to everyone whether you bring a tree or not. I strongly urge you to be prepared to take notes on the information that applies to you. We often seem to think that we will remember everything that was said. Not.

He knows it by it's common name

"Madagascar Tree".

After some searching online we've found the

latin name of the tree for those searching for one to buy. It's a mouthful,

Operculicarya decaryi.

It has other common names including Jabily and elephant tree. Per Wikipedia, It's a thick stemmed succulent plant species found in Madagascar and also grown as a bonsai tree.

Tak says it grows fast.

Once you have the latin name you'll find the plant is available from many sources including

San Marcos Growers. You can order from San Marcos Growers online and pick up the plants at affiliated nurseries like **Armstrong's**. Other sources are also available.
